HOW WE EQUIP & SUPPORT YOU

Disaster Recovery volunteers are required to complete a one-day training (either on-line, face-to-face or a combination of both) and participate in periodic team meetings and regional exercises. Training is required to ensure volunteers have the necessary skills and knowledge in preparation for any emergency situation. Disaster Recovery volunteer accreditation usually lasts for three years and training days for new volunteers are held regularly.

Volunteers are required to hold a current National Criminal History Check and a Working With Vulnerable People registration (ACT) or Working With Children Check (NSW). These checks are free for volunteers.
